Read letters from W. J. O'Donnell, the Council's Solicitor, dated 17th and 25th Jan 1917, stating with reference to the Criminal Injury claim of Mr. W. J. Patterson, that, owing to criminal proceedings which are now pending against some person arrested in connection with the burning of the flax and corn, the case has been adjourned till April.

The resolution of the Municipal council of Dublin calling on the Government to proceed with the construction of a harbour to make Galway a Trans-Atlantic port was adopted on the motion of Councillor O'Donnell seconded by Councillor McFolgan.

Resolutions forwarded by Portrush Urban Council relative to the encouragement of tourist traffic in Ireland were adopted on the motion of Councillor W. O'Donnell J.P., seconded by Councillor Chas McFolgan.

Read Resolution passed at their Meeting of 1st March 1917, by the Moville Parish Committee in connection with the County Committee of Agriculture & the Department's Scheme for Food Producers and Distributors, requesting the Council to reconsider their decision and put the Government Scheme into operation as the Committee feared a number of small holders would be unable to procure a sufficient supply for want of cash.

A complaint from Mr. Harry Diver, Ballybrack dated 14th April 1917 relative to the flooding of the road at Ballybrack which is preventing him from casting out his manure, was referred to the County Surveyor.

Read letters dated 16th March & 3rd and 10th April 1917 from Messrs Jas & Mr Harvey Son, Estate Agents, Derry complaining with regard to an opening alleged to have been cut in the fence and road water allowed to run into Mrs Fochrane's field at Ballyboskey, by the road contractor.

It was mentioned that water accumulates on the road at the place and that the Sisters of Mercy have been complaining about the children going to the convent school having in wet weather, to wade through the water and it was considered that if the tail drain along the Workhouse grounds to the river were deepened it might remedy both ^{prevalence}.

Ordered that the matter be referred to the County Surveyor and that Messrs Harvey & Sons be informed that while the council cannot recognise Mrs Fochrane's power to compel them to prevent the road water entering her field as it has always gone that way and is one of the disabilities that land adjoining a County road must suffer.

Yet they have no objections to meet Mrs. Cochrane's wishes in the matter if a possible plan at reasonable cost can be found.
